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### **Definitions**

- "Number of Students Who Began Program" means the number of students who began a program who were scheduled to complete the program within 100% of the published program length with the reporting calendar year and excludes all students who cancelled during the cancelation period.
- "Students available for graduation" is the number of students who began program minus the number of students who have died, been incarcerated, or been called to active military duty.
- "Number of On-Time Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program with 100% of the program length with in the reported calendar year.
- "On-time Completion Rate" is the number of on-time graduates divided by the number of students available for graduation.
- "150% Graduates" is the number of students who completed the program within 150% of the program. (Includes on-time graduates)
- "150% Completion Rate" is the number of students who completed the program in the reported calendar year within 150% of the published program length, including on-time graduates, divided by the Number of Students Available for Graduation.
- "Graduates available for employment" means the number of graduates minus the number of graduates unavailable for employment.
- "Graduates unavailable for employment" means the graduates who, after graduation, die, become incarcerated, are called to active military duty, are international students that leave the United State or do not have a visa allowing employment in the United States, or are continuing their education in an accredited or bureau-approved postsecondary institution.
- "Graduates employed in the field" means graduates who beginning within six months after a student completes the applicable educational program are gainfully employed, whose employment has been reported, and for whom the institution has documents verification of employment. For occupations for which the state requires passing an examination, the six-month period begins after the announcement of the examination results for the first examination available after the student completes an applicable educational program.
- "Placement Rate Employed in the Field" is calculated by dividing the number of graduates gainfully employed in the field by the number of graduates available for employment.
- "Number of Students Taking Exam" is the number of students who took the first available exam in the reported calendar year.



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- “First Available Exam Date” is the date for the first available exam after the students completed the program.
- “Passage Rate” is calculated by dividing the number of students who passed the exam by the number of graduates who took the reported exam.
- “Number Who Passed First Available Exam” is the number of graduates who took and passed the first available licensing exam after completing the program.
- “Salary” is as reported by the graduate or graduate’s employer.
- “No Salary Information Reported” is the number of graduates for whom, after making reasonable attempts, the school was not able to obtain salary information.



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## **STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL**

**STUDENT'S RIGHT TO CANCEL:** You have the right to cancel this agreement for a course of instruction through attendance at the first-class session (date: \_\_\_\_\_), or the seventh day after enrollment (date: \_\_\_\_\_), whichever is later for a full refund less \$250 nonrefundable deposit. Cancellation shall occur when you give written notice of cancellation at the address of the School shown on the top of the first page of the Enrollment Agreement. You can do this by mail or hand delivery. The written notice of cancellation, if sent by mail is considered effective when received by Massage Center.

## **WITHDRAWAL FROM COURSE:**

You have the right to withdraw from a course of instruction at any time. The institutional refund policy for students shall be a pro rata refund. If you withdraw from the course of instruction after the period allowed for cancellation of the Agreement, which is at the first-class session or the seventh day after enrollment whichever is later.

You are obligated to pay only for educational services rendered. The amount owed equals the daily charge for the program (total institutional charge, divided by the number of hours in the program), multiplied by the number of days student attended, or was scheduled to attend, prior to withdrawal.

A pro rata refund shall be no less than the total amount owed by the student for the portion of the educational program provided subtracted from the amount paid by the student, calculated as follows:

The amount owed equals the daily charge for the program (total institutional charge, divided by the hours in the program), multiplied by the number of days student attended, or was scheduled to attend, prior to withdrawal.

**IF THE AMOUNT YOU HAVE PAID IS MORE THAN THE AMOUNT YOU OWE FOR THE TIME YOU ATTENDED, THEN A REFUND WILL BE MADE WITHIN THIRTY DAYS OF WITHDRAWAL.**

**IF THE AMOUNT THAT YOU OWE IS MORE THAN THE AMOUNT THAT YOU HAVE PAID, THEN YOU WILL HAVE TO MAKE ARRANGEMENTS TO PAY FOR IT.**

**THE HIGHEST AMOUNT THE STUDENT WOULD PAY WOULD BE THE COST OF THE TOTAL TUITION OF \$4,500.00.**





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**Massage Center is an unaccredited institution and you will not be eligible for any Federal and State financial aid programs, since we do not participate in any State or Federal Financial Aid programs. If the student has received federal student financial aid funds, the student is entitled to a refund of monies not paid from federal student financial aid program funds.**

**HYPOTHETICAL EXAMPLE:**

Assume that a student, upon enrollment in a 550-hour course, pays \$4400 for tuition, including a \$250 registration / deposit fee, and withdrawals after completing 50 hours. The refund to the student would be \$3932 based on the calculation below.

- 1) \$4500 paid - \$250 registration fee = \$4250 for instruction
- 2) \$4500 for instruction / 550 hr. = \$8.18 for instruction / hr.
- 3) 50 hr. x \$8.18 for instruction / hr. = \$409.00 for instruction
- 4) \$418.18 for instruction + \$250.00 registration / deposit fee = \$668.18 retained by the school
- 5) The refund amount is \$4600 - \$668.18 = \$3931.82
